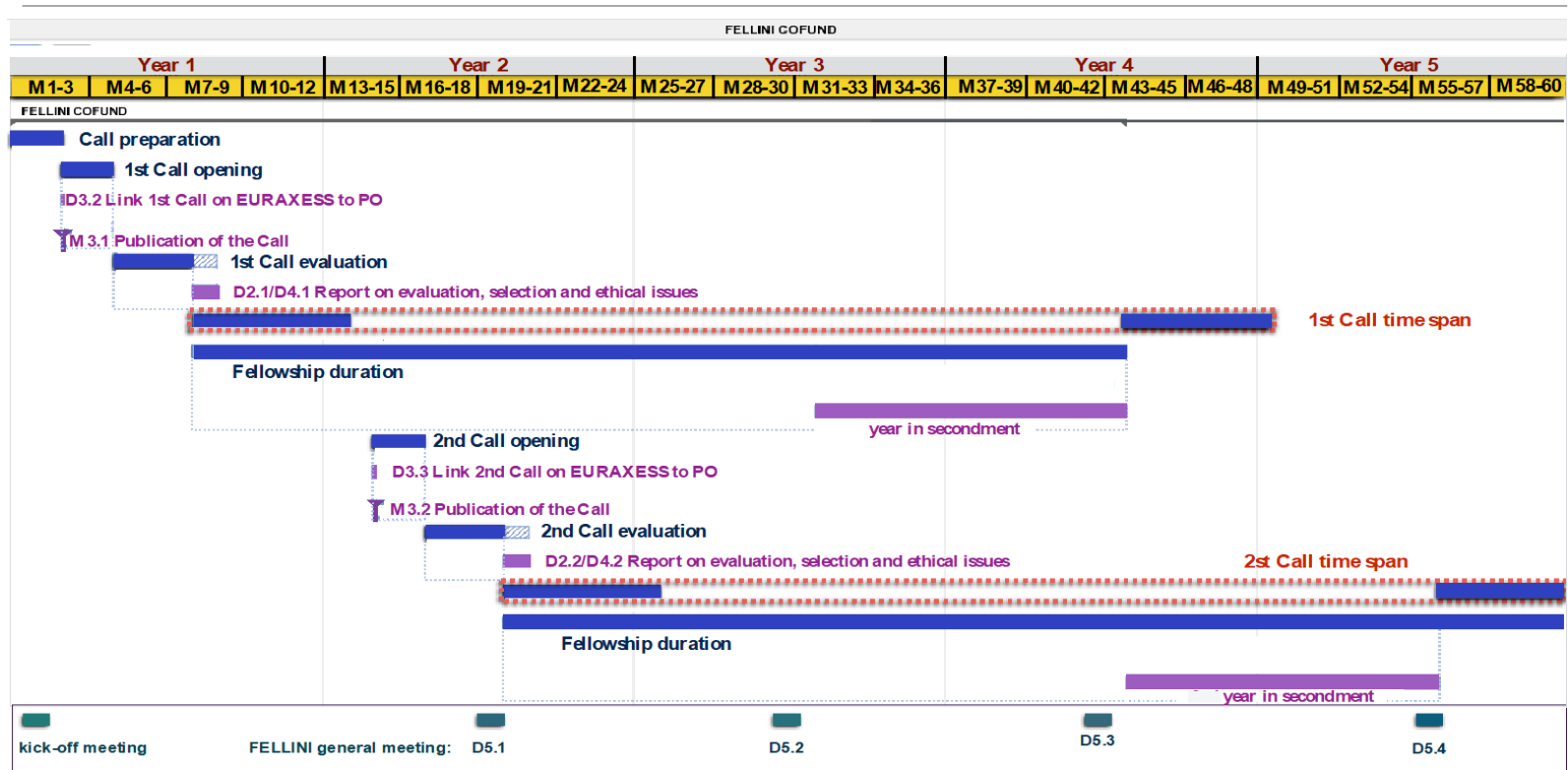

Project Timeline

01/01/2018 - 31/12/2022



Due to the covid travel restrictions, some fellows of the 2° call cannot come to Italy to start their fellowships before the end of June 2020, as previously agreed.

Budget



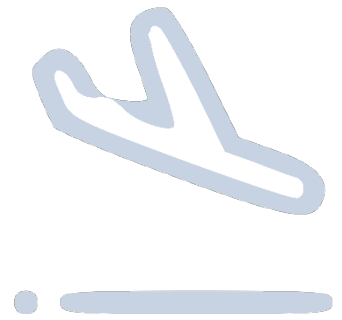
❑ Travel refund to INFN work location

During the Fellini fellowship/partnership and during the secondment a dedicated budget will be available at the INFN Unit and for which the fellow is responsible

❑ Research funds

❑ Training funds (300 €/month – see M. Masullo talk)

Travel Refund



Refund of the travel tickets to and from INFN work location at the beginning and at the end of the fellowship. Maximum of € 1.000 (€ 500 per journey supported by evidence of travel and proof of costs).



Research funds

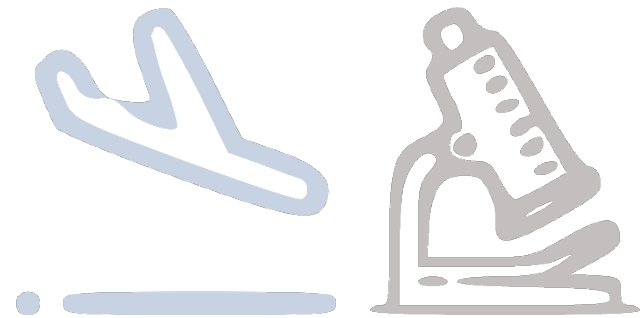
- The funds are calculated as follows:
 - for fellows in **theoretical physics** average of **800 euro/month**;
 - for fellows in **experimental physics** average of **1.200 euro/month**.
- At the beginning of each calendar year, the budget is calculated for the entire year. Any leftover budget from the previous year will be reassigned to the project around the end of March, as an INFN internal rule for all European funds.



Research funds

- **Movements of budget from a cost category to another are possible** depending on the specific Project activities. Indeed, one of the aims of the FELLINI program is to train the fellows in managing funds of their own project.
- The research funds can be used for activities, such as **purchasing of equipment, participation to conferences/workshop/meeting on topics directly connected to your FELLINI project or inviting guests** for scientific collaborations needed to realize the FELLINI Project activity.
- Please consider that **equipment purchased with Project funds remains property of INFN.**

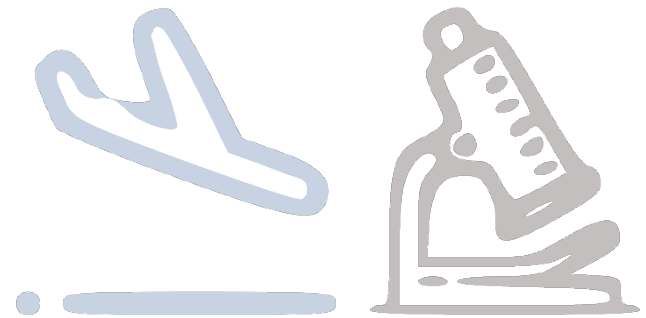
Secondment



- The Fellini projects provide the possibility of a secondment that can start from the second year of the fellowship and **should last one year.**
 - The secondment can also be split in 2 periods (minimum duration of six months) to be spent in the same external research institute or private company, or in 2 different ones.
- **Modification of Secondment duration requested to EU Commision via Amendment ->new duration: the secondment can last from six months to one year.**
 - In case of one year of secondment, it can also be split in 2 periods (minimum duration of six months) to be spent in the same external research institute or private company, or in 2 different ones.

An official answer from EU is expected in few weeks.

Secondment



The secondment has to meet the requirements of international, cross-sectoral or interdisciplinary mobility and can be spent:

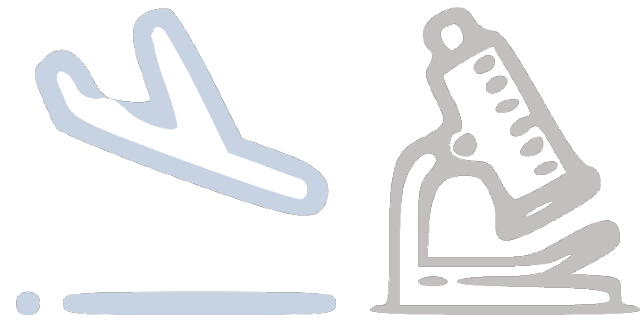
- **in another institute or laboratory outside of Italy.** A possible **exception to this rule** is the case where the research activity is **interdisciplinary**;
- **in a high-tech private company**, also in Italy;
- for researchers in the medical physics field, the possibility to spend a year **in hospitals or hadron-therapy centres** is also possible, in Italy or abroad.

What to do before the Secondment



- The Fellow will submit to the Fellini CB the proposal of secondment, agreed with supervisor, describing the scientific motivation of the proposed choice.
- In case of a secondment within a private company it is strongly recommended that the proposal is also discussed and agreed upon with some representatives of the company before the submission.
- **Once the proposal of secondment has been approved by the Fellini CB, the official activation procedure can start. This procedure typically takes at least three months.**

During the Secondment



- The fellow will be fully involved in R&D teams of the Institution/company and he/she will have a local tutor (Senior Researcher/Manager), with a long-standing experience;
- INFN supervisors and fellows will frequently meet to review the work done and evaluate the next steps, following the evolution of the research work;
- It is expected that the fellow will disseminate what he/she has learned to the other Fellows of the FELLINI project, through meetings, and to the INFN researchers, via seminars.
- Research and training yearly budget will be available also during the secondment and the research funds can also be used for the travel costs related to the secondment.
- Expenses for research training, travel and conferences, will be paid by INFN also during the Fellows' secondment period.
- During the leave the researcher will continue receiving the same salary from INFN.

Dissemination and Outreach

- **Dissemination** ensures that the results of the research developed in each single FELLINI fellow project are disseminated and exploited through communication and transfer into other research environments. Scientific publications and conference presentations are the major means of foreground dissemination.
- **Outreach** ensures that the results of the research and their broader impacts are communicated to a larger audience involving the general public and the society.

Both aspects are fundamental for the success of the FELLINI Programme and for the career development of the fellows.

Dissemination: EU funding Acknowledgment

- For all the **presentations/posters/scientific articles** related to the Project, the Commission requires to give appropriate information on EU funding and to the **G.A. 754496**.
- **Articles/Proceedings/Preprints**: The following text must be included in all scientific papers: ***“This project has received funding from the European Union’s Horizon 2020 research and innovation programme under the Marie Skłodowska-Curie grant agreement No 754496”***.
- **N.B. The above sentence must be used always if possible.** In some cases (e.g., for a publication of the whole scientific collaboration of which the FELLINI project is just a part) the sentence can be modified as follow: *[Fellow Name] has received funding....*).

N.B. Remember that the fellow worktime should be 100% on FELLINI project!

Dissemination: EU funding Acknowledgment

- Presentations/Posters: The EU emblem  must be always shown and the reference to the G.A 754496. Consider that the EU emblem must have an appropriate prominence when displayed with another one (e.g. the Project logo).
- As an example see the next slide in which EU emblem, FELLINI logo and reference to G.A. are displayed!!!!

Dissemination: Open Access rules

Open access to all peer-reviewed scientific publications relating to FELLINI results must be ensured. One can freely choose the most appropriate path to open access by following **two possibilities**:

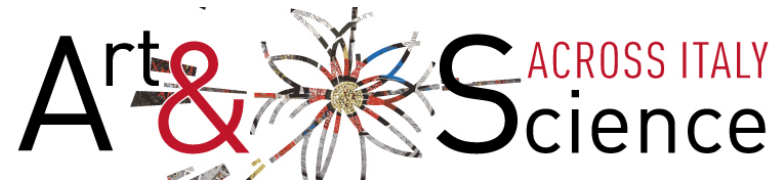
- **1. Self-archiving** ('green' open access) means that a published article or the final peer-reviewed manuscript is archived (deposited) in an online repository before (such as ArXiv etc.), alongside or after its publication. Repository software usually allows authors to delay access to the article ('embargo period'). If this route is chosen beneficiaries must ensure open access to the publication within a maximum of six months.

Dissemination: Open Access rules

Open access to all peer-reviewed scientific publications relating to FELLINI results must be ensured. One can freely choose the most appropriate path to open access by following **two possibilities**:

- **2. Open access publishing ('gold' open access)** means that an article is immediately provided in open access mode (on the publisher/journal website). Publishers sometimes charge so called Article Processing Charges(or APCs) to make articles open. For such a cost one can use the money from FELLINI research budget. Since typically the cost of APCs could be few keuro, we recommend this way only for fellow main articles related to their research project (e.g. first/single author papers). In the case of gold open access publishing, open access must be granted at the latest on the date of publication and you also have to deposit a copy in a repository.
