

KEY FIGURES OF CNRS AS A MULTI-DISCIPLINARY RESEARCH PERFORMING ORGANISATION (RPO)

- 10 INSTITUTES
- 34 000 people
- 3,5 billions of Euros
- 1000 research units
- 21 Nobel prize laureates and 12 Fields medal winners
- 50000 articles/year
 (WoS) + 6500 (SHS)
- Largest pluridisciplinary RPO in Europe





OPEN SCIENCE IN FRANCE AND CNRS

1. Creation of a National Open Archive HAL in 2001 by the CNRS, now the Interconnecting French Network Institutional Archives with 137 Institutional Repositories (HAL Portal), 580000 documents,

2. Digital Republic Law, October 2016, in France

Publications: a new right to author - Article 30: When a research is 50% publicly funded, the author retain the right to publish in open repositories 6 (STM) to 12 months (HSS) after publications

3. First France's National Plan for Open Science PNSO1), announced in July 2018, by the French Minister of Higher Education, F. Vidal, at LIBER's annual conference.

three keys committments: (1) Open Access to Publications; (2) Sharing Research Data and make it available through open access; (3) Be part of a sustainable european and international open science dynamics


- Signature of Plan S in Septembre 2018: ANR (national research funding agency) with 10 other european funding agencies
- 5. Second National Plan for Open Science PNSO2, launched in July 2021
- 6. Launch of « Recherche Data Gouv", the National Plateform for Sharing and Opening Research Data, in July 2022



OPEN ACCESS AT CNRS: WHERE WE ARE (46000 scientific articles in all CNRS units each year)

94 % of publications in Open Access within the 20000 articles per year published by CNRS scientists

- √ 77% OF PUBLICATIONS 2020 IN OPEN ACCESS (OBSERVED IN 2022)
- ✓ BIG INCREASE IN 3 YEARS FROM 49% TO 77%
- √ 90 % OF OPEN ACCESS PUBLICATIONS ARE ACCESSIBLE THROUGH




POLICY FOR USING HAL NATIONAL OPEN REPOSITORY

Starting in 2019, the deposit of publications in open archives such as HAL is almost MANDATORY:

Each researcher at CNRS fill in a scientific annual report. Now it is not possible anymore to fill in by hand the references of the publications. You have to first deposit the manuscript in HAL, then the field of publication will be automatically filled in.

Even more, since 2020, the manuscrit has to be deposited.

Concentration of a small number of publishers

3 big publishers Elsevier, Springer et Wiley issue 50% of the publications 13 publishers issue 80% of the publications

Rapid growing of the model « author-pays »

- Native open access platforms with mandatory payment of Articles Processing Charges
 Plos, MDPI (Multidisciplinary Digital Publishing Institute) and Frontiers Media
 Now MDPI fourth place just after Wiley
- Open access journals with mandatory payment of Articles Processing Charges which are very successful among scientists


PROJECTION WITH AN ECONOMICAL MODEL WITH APC ONLY

- ✓ NOT AFFORDABLE (CNRS WOULD PAY THREE TIMES MORE THAN TODAY)
- ✓ NON ETHIC (PAYED BY PHARMACEUTICAL COMPANIES)
- ✓ THE QUALITY OF PAPERS MAY BE LOWER (LOWER RATIO OF REJECTED PAPERS)
- **✓ WILL EXCLUDE A LOT OF COUNTRIES (BRAZIL ETC....)**





RECOMMANDATION FOR OPEN ACCESS PUBLISHING



ACTION PLAN FOR DIAMOND OPEN ACCESS launched in Europe by Science Europe, cOAlition S, OPERAS, and the French National Research Agency (ANR) (March 2022)

Some examples supported by CNRS: OpenEdition – Centre Mersenne – Episciences (overlay journals) – PCI (peer community in) – SMAI (mathematical journals) – S2O model (subscribe to open)







FAIR-IZATION OF RESEARCH DATA

- Develop a FAIR culture for data management and sharing.
- Practices vary from one discipline to another among communities.
- Support data infrastructures, including the issue of data repositories for "small data" (also called long-tail data)
- Support researchers with data management tools and joint publication/data repositories, in particular through the DMP OPIDOR tool for data management plan completion, and DOI assignment via Datacite (INIST)
- Assist large research infrastructures in setting up a data policy











NEW PRINCIPLES FOR RESEARCH ASSESSMENT AT CNRS

DORA signed by CNRS (JULY 2018)



- 1. Results themselves must be evaluated and not that they have been published in a prestigious journal
- 2. For each output cited in their assessment reports, researchers must explain their scope, impact, and personal contribution: full list of productions is not required.
- 3. All types of output should be entitled for consideration in the review
- 4. Scientific productions cited in the assessment report must be accessible in an open archive

The exhaustive list of publications is not anymore required



CHANGES TO THE FORMAT OF RESEARCHERS' ASSESSMENT FILES


- The diversity of researchers' contributions is taken into account, and researchers or applicants are asked to situate themselves on four aspects of their activities:
- 1. Contributing to the advancement of science
- 2. Supervising students, teaching, disseminating research products
- 3. Innovating, transfering, research results,
- 4. Managing and/or taking on collective responsibilities

The issue of commitment to geographical, thematic or functional mobility is also directly addressed.

- On 28 September, the European
 Commission launched the collection of signatures for an agreement whose signatories will form a coalition CoARA www.coara.eu to reform research assessment. The CNRS was among the first signatories.
- Recognizing diverse contributions and careers, taking into account activities such as teaching, supervising students, scientific mediation, innovation, involvement in open science or the community, etc.
- Being more qualitative and less quantitative (less bibliometrics indicators)
- 1st of December: Constitutive Assembly of CoARA and Election of the steering board.
